### **MEETING LOCATION**

The event will take place in the centre of Pisa, a small touristic town in the heart of Tuscany with about 90,000 inhabitants. There are 3 Universities: University of Pisa, Scuola Normale and Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna.

Pisa and its uniquely beautiful Piazza dei Miracoli, a UNESCO World Heritage site since 1987, have always been a fundamental stop on any holiday in Tuscany. Millions of people come here from every corner of the world every year to try, with the help of perspective, to keep the leaning tower standing.

Pisa boasts a thousand-year history (the name of the city dates back to the Etruscan era and refers to the nearby "mouth" of the Arno) which reached its peak at the time of the Maritime Republics, a period that created the center of the city as an artistic treasure trove with outstanding Romanesque and Gothic churches.

Pisan cuisine is characterized by simple dishes prepared with the best local ingredients, such as olive oil of the Pisan Mountains. In Pisa, you can taste excellent dishes based on fish or meat, including the steak of Mucco Pisano, a local bovine breed. At the same time Tuscany is known for its vegetable and legume soups based on cabbages, lentils or chickpea.


## 10th Meeting of the IOBC-WPRS Working Group

Pisa has a small airport (<a href="https://www.pisa-airport.com/en/">https://www.pisa-airport.com/en/</a>) at only 1,5 km from the central train station, and it is connected to the city with the 'people mover' (<a href="https://www.pisa-airport.com/en/the-passengers/transport/people-mover.html">https://www.pisa-airport.com/en/the-passengers/transport/people-mover.html</a>).

From the central train station busses circulate frequently. Taxis are waiting outside the airport terminal and will bring you to the city centre in about 10 minutes (about € 10). If you prefer a walk, it will take you about 20-30 minutes to get right to the city centre from the airport.
